## Speakers and Topics : “CCTV - Innovation”

### WELCOME—by our Chairman, ALEC HERD

Please note: presentations will not necessarily be in the order indicated, and might be subject to change.

### ANDREW RENNISON - Interim CCTV Regulator

Appointed in December 09 with a 12 month remit to advise government of advising Government on matters surrounding the use of CCTV in public spaces, including the need for a regulatory framework overseen by a permanent CCTV Regulator. Halfway through his tenure in office, what are his impressions ?

### GRAEME GERRARD - DCC Cheshire Constabulary (TBC)

Graeme, always a firm favorite with conference delegates, has recently concentrated on the National Strategy. Now for something different, he will be looking at issues in the National picture in his role with ACPO, as well as developments in CCTV back at the ranch in Cheshire.

### JUDITH JONES - Information Commissioner 's Office

Judith deals with most of the CCTV issues referred to the Information Commissioners Office. In this presentation, which follows the appointment of ChristopherGraham a year ago, we hear of any significant changes of approach regarding the ICO and CCTV.

### CHARLIE HODGES - Missing Persons Unit - NPIA

Bearing in mind the effect the images of Jamie Bulger being led to his death had on the development and expansion of CCTV in the mid 90's, it is fitting that the Missing Persons Unit of the NPIA wish to have a more organised approach to gaining the assistance of CCTV Managers in searching for those who are particularly vulnerable. Charlie will expand upon the proposals supported by the User Group.

### BARRY ROONEY - Visimetrics & CRIMEVIS - Video Analytics

Delegates will recall from a previous conference presentation that CrimeVis is a TSB Government sponsored research and development project undertaken by a consortium including Visimetrics, Omnipercception, PERA, Loughborough University and others (including the CCTV User Group) to develop a rapid search facility capable of taking images from a wide variety of image formats. Prototypes have been developed and tested and Barry will update delegates on progress.

### SIMON DAVIES AND GUS HOSEIN - 8020 Thinking

Simon is probably better known as the Founder and Director of Privacy International, but in this initiative they are representing 8020 Thinking who are developing an online assessment system which will enable both existing and prospective users of CCTV to test the degree to which their system will comply with the requirements of the Data Protection Act.

### KEVIN WHITE - LB of Hammersmith and Fulham

Kevin recently did a presentation for the SIA on the need to form a Group to support and represent CCTV Operators, suggesting that the CCTV User Group would be the ideal vehicle to achieving this. Kevin outlines his thoughts as to the need and the way forward.

### THE FUTURE OF TRANSMISSION - (Speaker TBC)

Over the last few years there have been major advances in transmission technology, including wireless, IP, and now the instruction from OFCOM for BT to allow other transmission providers to use their duct network for other fibres.

### STEVE FARLEY, TONY O'BRIEN - Bexley Council / Siemens

The proposed outsourcing of the management and Operation of the Bexley CCTV system to Siemens was featured in the April issue of CCTV Image. This joint presentation by Steve Farley of Bexley and Tony O'Brien of Siemens will detail the advantages to both parties from the outsourcing arrangements and how it will work in practice.
